From the Pastor

Dear People of Parkside,

Lutheran Theologian and Pastor, The Rev. Dietrich Bonheoffer once wrote, "Silence in the face of evil is itself evil: God will not hold us guiltless. Not to speak is to speak. Not to act is to act." This conviction led Bonheoffer to actively participate in the German resistance against the Nazi regime. The truth is that Bonheoffer was in the minority. Most of the Lutherans in Germany said and did nothing to prevent the rise of such hate in their country. Let us not make the same mistake.

On May 14th evil came to Buffalo and shot 13 children of God, killing ten. They were targeted because they were Black. The terrorist picked this Top's because of the history of systemic racism that has created a deeply segregated Buffalo. Evil then visited an Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas; 19 students and two teachers dead. There is brokenness and pain begging for people of God to make a difference to bring about transformation through the love of Jesus.

How will we respond?

After the Top's shooting, your church council and I immediately decided to display two large public signs. One side says, "Black Lives Matter." The second sign says, "Dismantle White Supremacy." We acknowledge that these words without action are meaningless. We repent that we didn't act and speak sooner. Nevertheless, we all felt compelled to speak loudly and publicly.

We should be clear there are no easy or simple answers. But we must try. We try not because God needs our works but because our neighbors are literally dying. How will we now respond to another mass shooting?

I do not want to diminish that one response is the continued growth and vitality of our church community. We live in a world where folks can (continued on page 2)

choose to be isolated and are able to find social media communities where everyone thinks the same. 

Perhaps, awkward conversations, making mistakes, committing time, money, energy, the way we worship, and our own comfort might just be a few of the things we risk for the sake of a faith that makes a difference in our world. I don't pretend to have the answers but I do hope you will join me in wrestling, searching, and trying.

I give thanks to God for your partnership in ministry. None of Parkside's ministries would be possible without you. Together we pick up the Cross of Christ knowing that the Tomb is empty and victory will be ours. Amen.

What's going on with the organ?

Parkside's Skinner Organ is in need of some TLC. This instrument was built in 1924 with 1,883 pipes, 28 ranks, 3 manuals, 25 stops, and 30 registers. However, over time the plaster around the walls and ceiling of one of the Organ chambers has deteriorated. (A previous "quick fix" lasted several decades but you can see panels sagging in one of the pictures) This results in dust and sometimes larger chunks clogging pipes. Sometimes even making pipes get stuck in the open position, known as a cipher. (Hence the paper towels in the last picture to make sure we don't hear that particular note for all of worship.) We are working with Heritage Pipe Organ Company to remove the pipes from the most problematic chamber. This will enable Parkside to seek solutions and take better care of this incredible instrument. While the pipes are removed from one chamber, we will still be able to use the other parts of the Organ that are not impacted. Stay tuned for more updates!

Other Notes and Information:

- We are still collecting refundable bottles to raise funds for coffee hours & other church services.
 Collection totes are in Atonement Hall and in the closet inside Stowell Lounge, just next to the kitchen.

We are sharing financial information for the first quarter. As you are probably aware, we have budgeted a deficit of \$72,000 for 2022. (if you would like a copy of the Annual Budget, or have questions about this report, please contact the office). While facing a projected deficit of this size is sobering, Parkside has experienced consistent growth over the past four years, despite the pandemic, and we expect this trend to continue. We will be officially welcoming several new members this year. We are pleased to report that in the first quarter of 2022, donations exceed budget, and for this, we are truly thankful! We are committed to good stewardship of Parkside's mission and resources, and are grateful for those who contribute their time, treasure and talent through these challenging times and beyond.
